<u>Language Arts</u>: Tweet, tweet – What's all the chirping about in Mrs. Debbie's room? It's the boys and girls learning about birds! We will discover that birds hatch from eggs, are the only animals that have feathers, and that while all birds have wings, not all birds can fly. We'll also learn the names for and how to recognize a variety of backyard birds. Look for a real bird's nest to appear on our theme table! Our week will end with a fun rhyming game as the students enjoy building words using the "at" and "ot" word families.

Concept: Throughout the week we will be discussing several characteristics which birds possess, such as how they hunt and gather food as well as how they build a nest. We will also continue to estimate how many steps it will take to get from one place to another in our room.

<u>Craft & Writing</u>: This week in Craft & Writing the boys and girls will explore all about birds. Some papers this week will include a connect the dots 1 -10 to make a bird, writing the missing numbers in the blank spots, and painting a picture of a robin.
