Concept

Mrs. Ann will lead her class on an outdoor exploration. The children will look for items including sticks, leaves and sand. The children will enjoy compare and contrast activities during the year. Comparing a crayon to a pencil will be first on the list. For tactile experience the sand table will be used this week.

Motor

Ms. Cheryl will have the children up and moving with a game of "Following Directions". Some examples of these would be touch your toes, clap 2 times, turn around, etc. Ball rolling and tossing at a target will be introduced. Hand-eye coordination will be enhanced using the ball and wand. If the weather permits, we will enjoy some outside time. Throughout this week Ms. Cheryl will read a story about germs and will promote proper bathroom etiquette.

Craft & Writing

Ms. Jen will use printing papers to familiarize the children with the letters Cc and Dd. Bee Polite and Bee Sad puppets will buzz into the classroom to discuss and display good manners. We will practice how to hold our pencils correctly and make a "Bee Friendly" craft.

Language

Mrs. Melissa will begin the week by introducing the letters Cc and Dd and adding them to the phonics board. The phonic board contains pictures cards that the children match to the corresponding letters. Mrs. Melissa will reinforce good manners using the Bee Polite and Bee Sad puppets. Our puppets will help the children distinguish between appropriate and inappropriate behaviors. We will also use our story time and teaching pictures to help support aur thama
