Language Arts: A fun, new home/school activity called "The Surprise Box" will begin this week in Mrs. Debbie's room. Each day, a student will be selected to bring the Surprise Box home and place an object of their choice inside. The child, with the assistance of the parent, then completes the included clue sheet. The next day, the student brings the Surprise Box back to school, tells their clues to the class, and the rest of the children will then try to guess what the mystery object is! This is a great game that helps build our vocabulary, literacy, and critical thinking skills. The boys and girls will learn about reptiles this week, too. We will discover that reptiles are cold-blooded creatures that have dry, scaly skin, and hatch from eggs. We'll be sure to include alligators, snakes, turtles, and lizards in our discussion. We'll also talk about amphibians and what makes them different from reptiles.
