
Language Arts: The children will have fun working with opposites and rhyming words. The concepts in/out, happy/sad, empty/full, and many/few will be introduced through cut and paste activities. Look in your child's folder for an envelope of letters. These are from the back of our Phonics workbooks. Please encourage your child to practice their phonetic sounds and building word skills using the letters. Over these weeks, we will learn the letters Ss, Tt, Uu, and Vv. We will work on these letters in our phonic workbooks. In addition, we will continue working with shapes and colors. We will practice drawing shapes to match the picture given. A spooky opposite's paper and a pumpkin rhyming page will help us practice these skills. We have been learning about fall and Halloween with cute songs. Hope the children are sharing them with you!

Our math workbooks will continue to focus on the number 9. We will identify the number, numeral, and sets of nine. We will also practice telling time by the hour.

Science: We will enjoy many fun pumpkin activities. We'll estimate how round our pumpkin is, carve the pumpkin, then estimate and count the number of seeds inside. We will be using all five of our sense!

Social Studies: A partner leaf exploration activity will get the students working as a team to compare and contrast different leaves by color, size, shape, and roughness.
