<u>Concept:</u> We have many fun Christmas activities planned for the next two weeks. One of our main areas of concentration will be numbers and estimation. The children will be in for a surprise when they see what festive holiday items appear in the counting jar. We will also continue to work on compare and contrast using a sock and a Christmas stocking as well as a winter hat and Santa hat. A listening activity "What did you hear" will be introduced. I will have the children listen to three or four different sounds. Then they will close their eyes as I repeat one of the sounds and guess which one they hear.

<u>Craft & Writing:</u> Over the next few weeks we will be introducing the letters Oo, Pp, Qq, Rr, shapes star and pentagon, as well as the numbers 15 and 16. Some papers will include recognizing and tracing the upper and lower case letters, and tracing our new shapes as well. The children will begin to work on a very special holiday project. It will arrive home in time for Christmas!
