Language Arts: Ask your child to show you how to chop and sweep a word! We take a word like bat, and we chop each letter against our arm while they say the sound it makes. Then, we sweep the word off of our arm, as we put the sounds together and say the word. We will also review printing our upper and lowercase letters and review our alphabet starting back at the beginning with the letters Aa and Bb. The children have been doing an excellent job reading their books, printing their letters, and sounding out words. We will begin to work on blends, putting two letters together where each letter keeps its own sound.

Math: We will be reviewing many of the concepts that have been introduced so far. These concepts include: addition, place value, ordinal numbers, and greater than and less than. The children will be counting by 2's for the next few weeks and will review counting by 5's and 10's. Shapes and the terms vertex and sides will be reviewed. Building numbers with unit cubes will help to reinforce place value.

Science: We will study weather and learn about different types of weather we have in our country. The boys and girls will learn weather words such as rain, snow, sun, and clouds. Our class will also spend time learning how to read a thermometer. The word climate will be introduced, and the class will learn that a climate is the prevailing weather conditions of an area. During class, the students will play a fun riddle game called Which Season? The class will hear a riddle poem which will help them build our literacy skills and guess which season the riddle is talking about.
