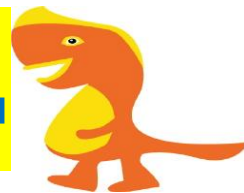

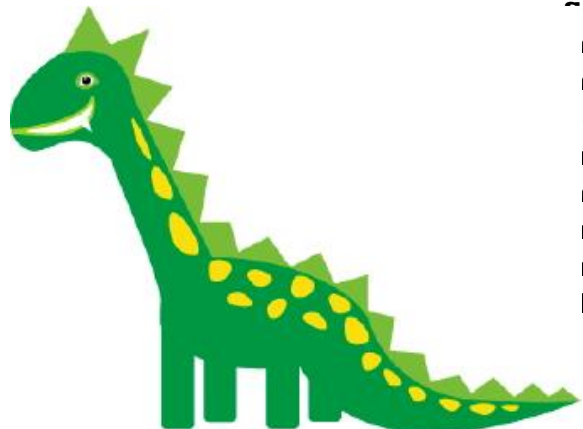
The Circle
